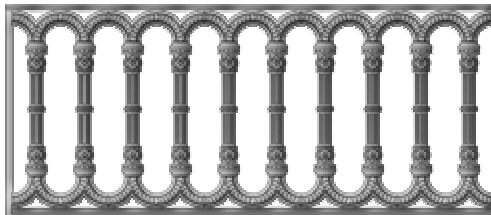
The Minetta Fence takes its name from the Indians who occupied this section of New York City in the times of New Amsterdam. The Minetta Brook, which was put underground in the 1820's, runs under this fence and house! This design is found in the Greenwich Village Historic District in New York City.

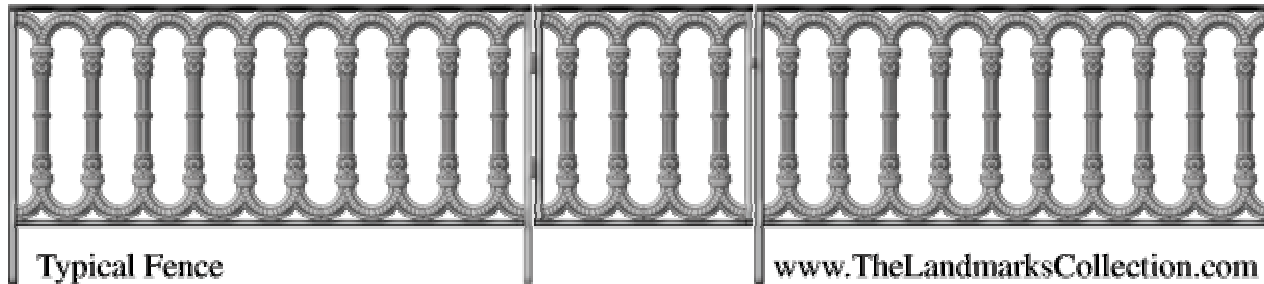

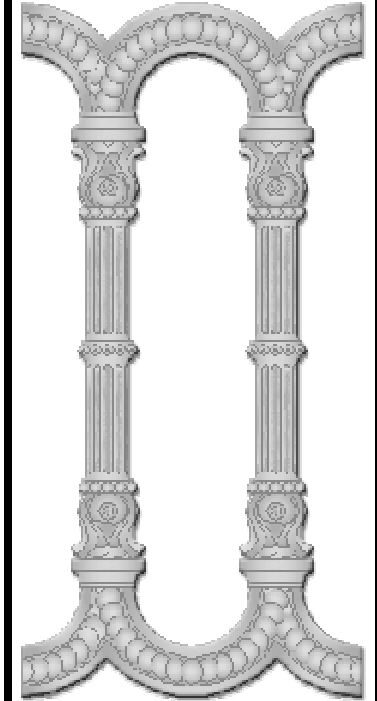
Standard Section
